Topic: Forensic Genetic Genealogy & Sexual Assault Kit Initiative (SAKI) Program

The ISPFS SAKI program utilizes federal grant funding from the Bureau of Justice Assistance to work on three purpose areas. First is the collection of DNA samples from convicted felony offenders who "lawfully owe" DNA under Idaho Code but a sample was never provided for the Combined DNA Index System (CODIS). The other two purpose areas involve the use of advanced DNA technology such as Forensic Investigative Genetic Genealogy to assist local law enforcement agencies in Idaho investigating cold cases involving sexual assaults, homicides, and missing persons.

The main topics will be:

- Forensic Investigative Genetic Genealogy
- SAKI Purpose Area 3 (PA3): Lawfully Owed DNA
- SAKI Purpose Area 4 (PA4): Cold Case w/sexual nexus
- SAKI Purpose Area 6 (PA6): Cold Case
