Thank you for your correspondence dated July 27, 2018, asking whether or not a valid concealed handgun permit or license issued in the state of Idaho is recognized in Maryland. I certainly understand your interest in this matter.

Unfortunately, Maryland law does not recognize handgun carry permits issued by any other state. Further, Maryland law does not authorize the State to enter into reciprocity agreements with any other states concerning the recognition of out-of-state handgun carry permits.
