
RE: Proposed Reciprocity Agreement on Licenses for Carrying of Concealed Firearms

Dear Deputy Attorney General Altig:

Thank you for your recent letter inquiring about the possibility of entering into a reciprocity agreement for concealed weapon permits with the State of California. California is a "may issue" state that vests local law enforcement with the discretion to decide whether to issue a concealed weapons permit to an applicant. (Cal. Pen. Code, § 26150.) They may do so only for California residents whose good moral character they have verified.¹ (Cal. Pen. Code, § 26150, subs. (a)(1), (3) and (c)(2).) The California Legislature has not provided a mechanism that would permit the Attorney General to waive the residency restriction, or local verification of moral character, by means of a reciprocity agreement with another state. ¹ A person who is temporarily in California may transport an unloaded firearm in a locked container in a motor vehicle. (Cal. Pen. Code, § 25610.)
