



Crimes Against Persons in 2005 Gender Comparison




- 27.9% of victims of crimes against persons were under 18 years of age.









Attempts and assaults to murder are classified as aggravated assaults and not as murder.

Murder Incidents by Type of Weapons Used in 2005













Juvenile Victims of Forcible Fondling by Age in 2005







Aggravated Assault Incidents by Type of Weapons Used in 2005









Simple Assault 5 Year Trend









Although the object of a kidnap may be to obtain money or property, kidnaping is a crime against persons. This offense includes not only kidnaping and abduction, but hostage taking as well. This category is intended to capture information on only the persons actually kidnaped or abducted, not those persons or organizations paying ransoms. Therefore, for each offense of kidnaping, the victims are only the persons taken or detained against their will.

- 45.1% of kidnaping/abduction victims were under 18 years old.
- 46.5% of incidents of kidnaping/abduction were from a residence.


