

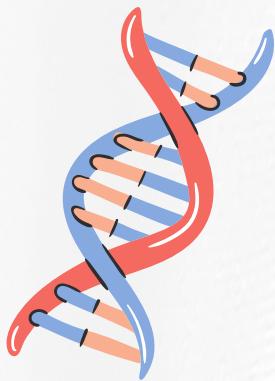
IDAHO STATE POLICE SAKI GRANT

The Idaho Cold Case and Advanced DNA Methods (ICCADM) team is working to collect DNA samples owed by offenders and use DNA technology to solve cold cases. The team is currently focused on three main purpose areas.



PURPOSE AREA 3: OWED DNA

Purpose Area 3 focuses on collecting missed DNA samples from offenders who lawfully owe them to the state. The ICCADM is currently working with law enforcement agencies across Idaho to assess the scope of the issue and identify best practices for collecting missed samples. The collection of owed DNA samples is an essential piece of solving open and cold cases.



PURPOSE AREA 6: VIOLENT CRIME COLD CASES

Purpose Area 6 focuses on all other violent crime cold cases. Similar to Purpose Area 4, members of the ICCADM collaborate with law enforcement, providing access to DNA/FIGG technology and other resources. Data on how agencies define, prioritize, and manage violent crime cold cases is collected.

PURPOSE AREA 4: SEXUALLY MOTIVATED COLD CASES

Purpose Area 4 focuses on using DNA/Forensic Investigative Genetic Genealogy (FIGG) to investigate sexual assaults and sexually motivated homicides. The ICCADM collaborates with investigators from law enforcement agencies and provides resources such as victim advocates, genealogists, and intelligence analysts to aid in solving cases.
