I. Opening

1) Call to Order

Chairman Sheriff Mike Hollinshead called the meeting to order at 2:28 pm

2) Silent Roll Call of Board Members

A roll call was conducted. All Board members but Colonel Wills were present in person or via Teams. Quorum achieved.

3) Approve submission of legislative request to extend temporary IDAPA Rule 11.10.01 until July 1, 2024, when the version approved by the Idaho Legislature during the 2024 session will take effect.

a. Action Item—Vote to approve the legislative request to extend the ILETS Temporary IDAPA Rule 11.10.01.

i. Matthew Smith called for a motion; Pursuant to Section 67-5226, Idaho Code, the Governor has found that temporary, and publish adoption of this rule, which is in substance as was presented before and approved by the Legislature during the 2024 legislative session, is appropriate to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Idaho.

These rules implement the duly enacted laws of the state of Idaho, provide citizens with the detailed rules and standards for complying with those laws, and assist in the orderly execution and enforcement of those laws.

The expiration of these rules without due consideration and processes would undermine the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Idaho and deprive them of the benefit intended by these rules.

The Governor has also found that the fees or charges being imposed or increased are justified and necessary to avoid immediate danger to the commission's budget, to the state budget, to necessary state functions and services, and to avoid immediate danger of a potential violation of Idaho's constitutional requirement that it balance its budget.

Therefore, we are adopting this temporary, published rule to be effective April 24, 2024. This temporary rule will expire July 1, 2024, when the final rule becomes effective. This temporary rule mirrors the final rule approved by the 2024 legislature; as adopted in HCR 42 document that finalized the rule docket 11-1001-2301.
