Idaho State Police receives revenue from the General Fund, Dedicated Funds, and Federal Funds. Generally, revenue collection for dedicated funds is built into user fees or taxes that finance a specific service or project - for example, vehicle registration fees or fuel tax funds. General funds are collected from taxes and fees imposed by the state, such as individual income and corporate tax, whereas federal funds include allocations for specific programs. Federal Dedicated Fund 40% funds are often passed FY23 through other state and local governments for criminal
